Sports and the Sustainable **Development Goals**

The United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development highlights sports as a unifying and inclusive vehicle: they contribute to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), in particular in terms of education, health, social cohesion, peace, and inclusion.

Sports play a key role in all societies:

- By improving physical well-being and mental health while, according to WHO, more than 80% of teens do not meet the recommended levels of physical activity, which puts their current and future health at risk
- By helping young people learn life skills and contributing to their personal development, making it a valuable educational tool
- By providing girls, women and vulnerable groups with a space for expression, freedom and empowerment, through a universal language that can fight stereotypes
- By providing young people with a source of fulfilling and diversified jobs, thus promoting economic development
- By providing a space for awareness-raising and mobilization to address the main social and environmental challenges

In line with this vision, and in connection with the organization of the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, France has given sports a more central role in its public policies. At the international level, this is reflected in a strong sports diplomacy which uses sport as a a tool for cooperation and youth mobilization.

AFD's Sport and Development Strategy



In February 2019, AFD Group adopted a "Sport and Development" strategy as part of its "100% Social Link" commitment. It has thus made sports an important field of activity in support of youth, the reduction of inequalities and social cohesion.

Under this strategy, AFD Group promotes and supports the development of Sport for development initiatives in the projects it finances. The objective is to improve access to sport for all, especially for young people, women and girls, and thus contribute to increasing access to education and strengthening gender equality.

AFD Group has thus created:

- An innovative space for investment and impact
- A space for dialogue, encouraging governments to mainstream sports in public policies
- A space for mobilization and partnerships



Financing

community sports facilities

AFD finances the construction and rehabilitation of community sports facilities, and provides support to institutional and sports actors to ensure that they are managed in a sustainable and inclusive manner.



Cameroon

SPORCAP €10 M



The project led by the Republic of Cameroon aims to facilitate access to sport for all, through the construction of sports facilities in five mediumsized cities, and capacity building for Cameroonian sports operators.

Bafoussam, Bamenda, Bertoua, Garoua and Maroua.

Expected impacts:

- Nearly 2 million people will benefit from increased access to sports activities, which will contribute to strengthening social cohesion
- 20 organizations with a greater capacity for the sustainable management and inclusive organization of activities in sports facilities



Action in **AFD Group format**

Expertise France, the French public agency for international technical cooperation, has also invested in the sector by implementing Sport for development projects, which include the rehabilitation and management of sports facilities.

DRC

"Pour Elles" **Culture and Sport** €10 M



Implemented by Expertise France, in close collaboration with the Congolese authorities. the project aims to improve the quality of life of more than 3,000 girls by promoting sports and cultural activities. It comprises the rehabilitation of five sports fields and two cultural spaces in four deprived areas of Kinshasa. It will also train more than 200 operators who will handle their management and activities.



It is the second AFD Sport for development project implemented by Expertise France, following the Basketball Experience program co-financed by the NBA. Expertise France is also deploying International Technical Experts in Cameroon, Gabon, Senegal and Tanzania who are helping the authorities to mainstream sports into their public policies.

Strengthening the public policy dialogue on sports

Through an enhanced dialogue with Ministries of Sport and Education, and by documenting the impact that sports have on economic and social development, AFD promotes the implementation of public policies on sports, in particular to support education and social cohesion.

Senegal



Assisting the authorities with the implementation of sustainable and transformative public policies on sports



AFD's main country of operation with close to €75 million committed in the sports sector since 2012, AFD Group is supporting the Senegalese Government's commitment to develop ambitious and inclusive public policies on sports.



In particular, AFD is supporting the legacy strategy of the **Dakar 2026 Youth Olympic** Games, the first Olympic event in Africa, through a €60 million loan to the State of Senegal. By reducing inequalities in access to public sports facilities and helping to structure Senegal's sports ecosystem, this support aims to maximize the impact of sports activities, as drivers of economic and social development.

AFD also finances the initiatives of regional and local authorities, such as the decentralized cooperation project between the City of Dakar and the Grand Paris Sud region on swimming instruction.







ISONGA - €1,5 M

AFD is assisting the Rwandan Ministries of Education and Sports with the implementation of a school sports policy. The objective is to promote sports activities for all at school, and identify young talents who will be able to develop a dual educational and sports project in dedicated centers.

Sports: Football, Basketball, Volleyball, Handball, Cycling, Athletics

Expected impacts:

- 360 trainers will benefit from capacity building
- Sports centers deployed in 17 schools across the country
- 600 young athletes supported in the sports centers



Supporting the professionalization of the sports sector

The sports economy accounts for 2% of world GDP, therefore offering promising opportunities in terms of economic growth and employment. AFD supports actors in the sports ecosystem through training and experience-sharing activities. The objective is to strengthen the governance of the sector and ensure that sport is inclusive and sustainable.



Mobilizing French technical expertise in social impact investment

AFD mobilizes the expertise of French sports stakeholders through organizations such as the National Institute of Sport, Expertise, and Performance (INSEP), the Center for Sports Law and Economics (CDES), and sports federations and clubs.

Multi-country Africa

Rugby Africa - €500,000

AFD has joined forces with Rugby Africa to promote women's rugby by training 270 leaders, coaches and referees from 9 African federations. The project aims to promote the empowerment and social and professional inclusion of women through rugby. In the legacy of the Rugby World Cup France 2023, the French Rugby Federation is supporting the implementation of this project by providing trainers.



The Sport Impact Summit A first for Africa

The Sport Impact Summit organized in Dakar in November 2023 was the first ever Sport for Development summit on African soil. The event was an opportunity for sports stakeholders and development finance institutions to discuss issues related to development through sport.





Building sustainable links with civil society and sports entrepreneurs

Civil society plays a major role in the Sport for development sector by leading important community-based projects. AFD supports both micro-projects led by associations and initiatives on a larger scale. Its objective is to strengthen the social impact of sport for all.

Support for Sport for development micro-projects



Total amount: **64.5** M

Number of projects: 120

The organizations selected through call for projects managed by *La Guilde and Sport Impact* have benefited from technical and financial support amounting to between €20,000 and €40,000.



A tool dedicated to civil society organizations

AFD has created the CSO Initiatives Fund, a financing mechanism available to French CSOs and local CSOs leading high-impact projects linked to AFD's countries and sectors of operation.

In 2023, AFD supported five projects submitted to the CSO Initiatives Fund which use sports as a driver for development



Multi-country - EJO 2 - €1.8 M

Countries: Burundi, Côte d'Ivoire, Liberia, Senegal

Play International has launched the second phase of the EJO project which is based on "Playdagogy" (playing on the words Play and pedagogy), a participatory teaching method using sports activities to address issues such as acquiring basic skills, reducing gender inequalities, and promoting social cohesion.

Expected impacts:

- Nearly 1,000 teachers and facilitators trained in "Playdagogy"
- 34,000 children benefiting from the activities organized by the project

Partnerships and mobilization

By connecting funders and project leaders through the Sport en Commun platform, which has 2,600 member organizations in 52 African countries.







By creating, through the Finance en Commun Summit (FiCS), a coalition for Sustainable Development through Sport which encourages all the Public Development Banks to work together to boost investment in the sector.

AFD x Paris 2024: Creating a lasting legacy for the Games
